Following orders is not optional. Getting enough fluids during a day in the sun is a full time job. Sleep at the end of a

long day is a wonderful pleasure. A number of people who don't know anything about each other can come together and the experience of doing something together creates some interesting bonds. But you probably knew all this. There are some parallels to being the church here.

Doing ministry well requires lots of work and at times under difficult circumstances. But in our case God is always there to lift our burdens and create special blessing from the sacrifices. Although we all come from somewhat different spiritual experiences and have different backgrounds with a little patience and determination we can still make things work. (But there are obstacles to overcome.) Being obedient to the Lord is not optional for us. There is always a consequence for our disobedient. The spiritual nutrition that

we need everyday is something we need to be aware of throughout our day. (You can't drink enough in the morning to last). We need to keep the spiritual cup full throughout the day. God does give us rest. We can take joy and even pleasure in the time He gives to us to relax in Him and to enjoy His wonderful world.

And finally a group of people like the church who may not know each other really well can still come together and have an amazing experience that creates some very significant bonds in the group. I will probably never work as an extra again but I will continue to be a part of God's church as long as I live. The church is the real adventure where lives are really changed and people can be who they really are. We don't pretend to be the church. We are the church! Thank you, Jesus. PK
